What you should know to vote Nov. 3

How to register to vote

The Presidential election is less than two months away, and the last day to register to vote is Oct. 7.

Anyone who is not already registered can do so at the Lake Ozark City Hall, 3162 Bagnell Dam Blvd., at any municipality or at any county clerk's office. City of Lake Ozark residents who live in Miller County vote at Mt. Carmel Baptist Church, 755 Bagnell Dam Blvd, Lake Ozark. Lake Ozark residents who live in Camden County vote at the Lodge of Four Seasons Exhibition Hall.

Residents who live on Horseshoe Bend beyond the Lake Ozark city limits should contact the Village of Four Seasons or the Camden County Clerk's office to find out where they vote.

How you can vote

Missouri offers three ways to vote in the 2020 General Election:

- •In-person at a designated polling location.
- Absentee (requires a notary unless the request is due to incapacity or confinement due to illness or



physical disability)

•Mail-in (requires a notary).

Absentee

The deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail is 5 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 21.

Submit the request to your local election office and be sure to request your ballot as far in advance of the election as possible.

Mail-in

Mail-in or faxed absentee ballot requests must be received by the election authority no later than the 5 p.m. on the second Wednesday prior to any election. Voters can vote by absentee in the office of the local election authority until 5 p.m. the night before the election.
